CHURCH HILL, West side

**CHURCH VIEW CHURCH HILL ROAD West side
Formerly the Lady Hoare Trust premises
with the House and Mews Cottage**

Grade II SU 8821

One building. Early C19. Stuccoed. Tiled roof. Glazing bars intact on first floor. Doorway with pilasters and projecting cornice. C19 shop window to the south of this. 2 storeys. 2 windows.

**FORGE COTTAGE, CHURCH HILL, West side
The former Forge Building
Midhurst Old Forge**

Grade II SU 8821

This building stands endwise to the street in the alley in front of Forge House. Early C19. Red brick. Tiled roof. Casement windows. One storey. 3 windows. Included for historical reasons as an old town forge.

APSLEY HOUSE, CHURCH HILL, West side

Grade II SU 8821

House. Early C19. Stuccoed. Hipped tiled roof. Glazing bars intact on first floor. Doorway with pilasters to the south of this, the top half of which is now glazed. Continuous cornice over both. Two storeys. Two windows.

CHURCH HILL DENTAL PRACTICE, CHURCH HILL, West side
(Formerly listed as D Morton Hickson, Chemist)

Grade II SU 8821

House and shop. Endwise to the road. C18. Stuccoed, south wall red brick. Tiled roof. Glazing bars intact on first floor. Gable end to the street with modern shop front. Two storeys. Three windows. Included for group value.

TRINITY COTTAGE, CHURCH HILL, West side

Grade II SU 8821

House. Early C19. Stuccoed. Gabled front. Tiled roof. Glazing bars intact. Doorway with flat hood over. Three storeys. One window.

**OLD MANOR COTTAGE, ELOIS and another
now private houses
listed as Campbell Walchli Antique and Old Manor House Restaurant**
(Formerly listed as No 4 Church Hill and Old Manor Cafe)

GRADE II SU 8821

House and two shops. One building. C17 timber-framed building, said to date from 1634. Now faced with painted brick on ground floor and roughcast above. The northernmost window-bay added in the early C19 in brick, now painted. Gable in centre. Two gables to the south of it. Tiled roof. Casement windows. Modern shop fronts. Two storeys. Five windows.

BIRDCAGE HOUSE AND LYNDALE HOUSE, CHURCH HILL, West side
(Formerly listed as Eagle House and Lyndale House)

GRADE II SU 8821

Pair of late C18 houses. Red brick. Stringcourse. Parapet. Hipped tiled roof. Glazing bars intact. Iron frames for window-boxes on first floor. Round-headed doorway with raised architraves alternately of red brick and stone. Two storeys. Four windows.

4 HOUSES/BUSINESSES, RED LION STREET, West side
Arnolds Opticians, ???, Comestibles, currently Empty shop
Originally the Red Lion Inn
Listed as BIRD POTTER AND

MIDHURST VALET SERVICE
and EWEN HOUSE,
(formerly listed as Premises 25
yards north of West Street)

Grade II SU 8821

One building, originally the Red Lion Inn. Now four shops or business houses with accommodation over. C17 or earlier timber-framed building, now faced with roughcast. First floor oversails. Tiled roof. Casement windows. Modern shop fronts. Malcolm Whiteheads has a gable with carved bargeboards and an iron bracket of the former inn-sign. Two storeys and attic. Seven windows. One dormer.

**HOUSE OF ANITA and TUDOR CRAFT, RED LION STREET, West Side
now Wheelers Book Shop
formerly Anita Hairdresser on first floor**

Grade II SU 8821

House and shop. C16-17 timber-framed building now faced with roughcast. First floor oversails with curved brackets. Tiled roof. Sash windows on first floor with glazing bars intact. Modern shop window below. Two storeys. Two windows.

**SUSSEX HOUSE, RED LION STREET, West side
(Formerly listed as Shop on North corner of West Street)
now South Downs Property Solutions**

Grade II SU 8821

House. South portion. C18. Stuccoed. Modillion eaves cornice. Tiled roof. Glazing bars intact on first floor. On ground floor old fluted pilasters flank modern plate glass shop windows. Two storeys. Three windows. North end, originally a separate building, is a C16 timber-framed building with plaster infilling and diagonal braces. Stone plinth, cemented. First floor oversails on moulded bressumer. Tiled roof. Four-light shallow bay window projecting on corbels on first floor. Modern bay window on ground floor. Two storeys. One window.
